

Open PostDoc/PhD Position in Visualization at TU Vienna, Austria

There is an open position at the Institute of Computer Graphics and Algorithms (ICGA), TU Vienna, in the area of medical visualization. Together with our company partner GE Healthcare the interactive high-quality rendering of ultrasound data will be investigated. Various advanced lighting effects shall be simulated and integrated into our existing VolumeShop framework (http://www.volumeshop.org).

We are offering a one-year PostDoc position or alternatively a two-year PhD position (with a potential extension for a third year). Starting date is as soon as possible.

To apply for the position, you should fulfill most of the following requirements:

- PhD or graduation in computer science (or similar) = mandatory!
- Scientific expertise in the field of visualization, medical visualization, volume rendering, computer graphics.
- Practical experience with GPU programming is recommended.
- You intend to do PostDoc or PhD research.
- Motivation to do a limited amount of administrative work at the Institute, including a little bit of teaching.
- Very good English knowledge in speaking and writing; German is appreciated, but not required.
- Humor and social integration.
